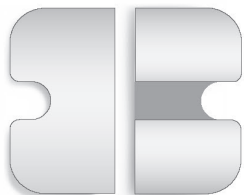

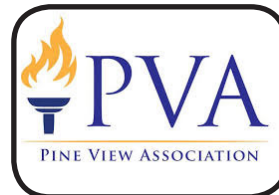

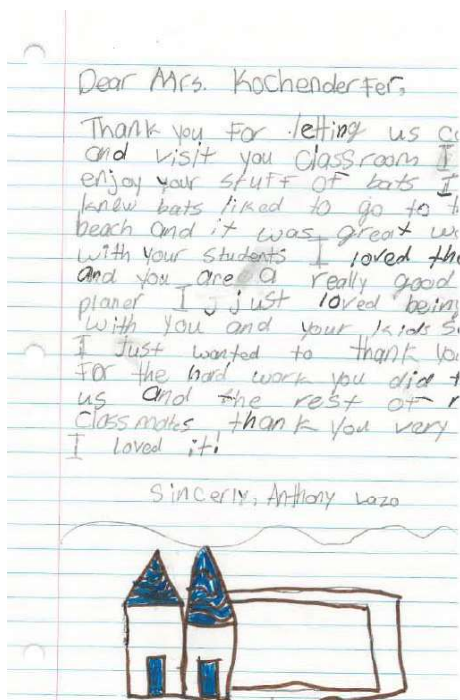
# “UP With Books”

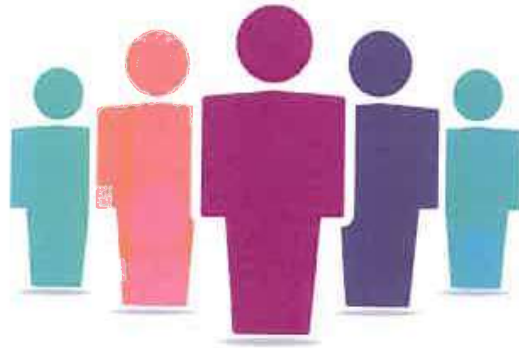

# The Middle School Student Astronaut Challenge Team Places 1<sup>st</sup> in the State Engineering Challenge

Maybe you saw the piece about this team on SNN, February 28<sup>th</sup>

These students are all in 8<sup>th</sup> grade and will compete next year in the High School Division. We are looking to create a new Middle School Team now for next year. The Middle School Team is open to grades 6 through 8. The regional competition is held the 3<sup>rd</sup> weekend of September in Orlando. Teams of 5 students study a 200-page manual and take a written 2-hour test of 100 questions. No limit on the number of teams, however, there is a limit of one team per school allowed to advance to the State competition. Thus, making it very competitive. The winning team can select an alternate.

The State competition has 4 challenges:

1. Simulator: Students are given one of 3 positions as crew of a mission, commander, pilot, engineer, or 2 positions as Mission Control. They go through the check list for prelaunch, launch, retrograde, and return.
2. Landing: Only 2 take part in this challenge of landing the shuttle on a runway for accuracy.
3. Lab: Students are given a problem to solve. They research it, write a paper, create a power point, and present their solution to a panel of scientists.
4. Engineering: Students memorize formulas that they might be asked to use. They get a packet of problems to solve in 45 minutes, then present their solution to a panel of mathematicians.

There is a high degree of parent involvement of time and finances.

If you and your child have a passion for space exploration, space science, or a related field and you would like more information, Mrs. Hollar the PV coach and administrator for the team will give a detailed informational meeting in her classroom, room 407 in the orange building, on Wednesday, April 25, at 4 pm. High School students and parents are welcome as well.

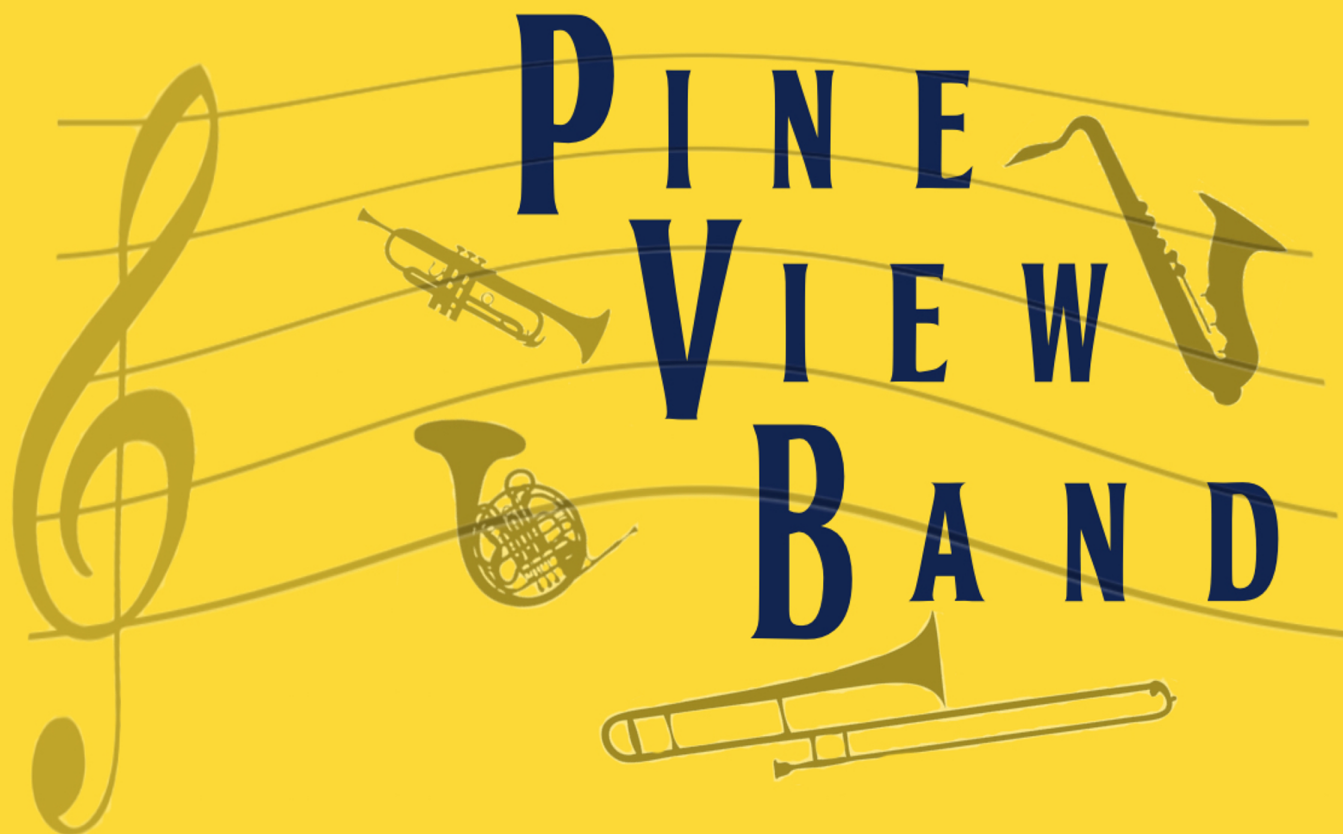

Pine View’s Wellness Committee, working with Elementary Assistant Principal, Alison Rini, has chosen Michele Borba’s *Unselfie: Why Empathetic Kids Succeed in Our All-About-Me World* for this year’s book club. Below we share some of what we are learning from this renowned author and educational psychologist.

As a school, Pine View is committed to stopping bullying, and one of the most powerful ways to stop bullying is through education and empowerment of witnesses. “When bystanders step in on behalf of bullied peers, bullying stops more than 57 percent of the time and within 10 seconds.”<sup>i</sup>

However, all across the world students can experience obstacles or hesitations when they see something uncomfortable. What prevents students from stepping in to stop bullying is the same across all of the different countries the author has studied – below she shares ways to address each obstacle.

Obstacle experienced by bystanders	Ways to overcome the obstacle
<p>Powerlessness – The vast majority of bullying incidents occur in the presence of other kids, but not in front of adults. The kids who witness the problem often don’t know what to do.</p>	<p>Practice these strategies, one at a time to STAND UP:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Seek support</b> – turn to another bystander to rally support – “That’s mean!” or “Let’s help.”</li> <li>• <b>Tell a trusted adult</b> – differentiate “tattling” (getting someone INTO trouble) from “telling” (getting someone OUT of danger).</li> <li>• <b>Assist the victim</b> – ask if they need help or if they want to go somewhere else. Empathize: “I know how you feel.”</li> <li>• <b>Negate with a positive view</b> – stop rumors by challenging them with a positive perspective. “I think she’s nice.” Or “I was there and that’s not what I saw.”</li> <li>• <b>Design a detour</b> – drain the audience to reduce the bully’s power. “Let’s go!” Walk away yourself or leave a group chat to demonstrate disapproval.</li> <li>• <b>Use a distraction</b> – Ask a question or change the subject. “Why aren’t you at practice?” or “Did you see the game last night?”</li> <li>• <b>Pause and rethink</b> – Help other bystanders get perspective – “How would you like hearing that about yourself?” or “Watch out – he’ll get hurt.”</li> </ul>

<p>Vague expectations – Sometimes kids aren’t sure if this is something they should get involved in. Is it really bullying or are the other kids actually having fun?</p>	<p>Define bullying with the acronym CAP:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>C</b> – Bullying is repeated <i>cruel</i> behavior</li> <li>• <b>A</b> – Bullying is never <i>accidental</i> – the child who is bullying is intentionally causing another kid verbal, emotional, and/or physical pain</li> <li>• <b>P</b> – Bullying is a <i>power</i> imbalance: the target cannot hold their own and needs help</li> </ul>
<p>Peer pressure – Kids don’t want to get someone in trouble.</p>	<p>Educate students that their report can be anonymous and that they will not be in trouble for helping protect someone from being hurt.</p>
<p>Bystander effect – When multiple people witness an event, each person feels less responsible for stepping in.</p>	<p>Talking with your child explicitly about your values and their power. Teach skills such as:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Positive self-talk – “I can do this.” “I’m not the only one who feels this way.”</li> <li>• Mental rehearsal – develop a plan and visualize yourself doing it</li> <li>• Chunk it – don’t take on the whole challenge at once. Think about it in small steps and work on one at a time.</li> <li>• Deep Breathing</li> </ul>
<p>Intense emotions – Feeling “too bad” to help.</p>	<p>It’s okay to stand with the victim after the fact even if you weren’t able to do anything at the time. Use your HEART:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>H</b>elp – Get a band-aid or a tissue. Ask others to help. Clean up the mess.</li> <li>• <b>E</b>mpathize – “I’ve seen that happen to other kids.” “I know how you feel.”</li> <li>• <b>A</b>ssist – “Can I help?” “I’ll get a teacher.” “Want to go to the clinic?”</li> <li>• <b>R</b>eassure – “You’re not the only one.” “I’m here for you.” “We can get help.”</li> <li>• <b>T</b>ell how you feel – “That wasn’t fair.” “I’m so sorry that happened to you.” “You didn’t deserve that.”</li> </ul>
<p>Weak adult support – When parents and teachers don’t take things seriously students stop reporting incidents of concern.</p>	<p>Pine View faculty and staff are committed to listening to our students and taking their concerns seriously. A group of teachers recently shared information from a book study on best practices to eliminate bullying<sup>ii</sup>, and we will continue to try to improve in our responsiveness and results.</p>
